



HEARING CONSERVATION

Instructional Program

CSUDH has instituted a training program for all employees who are exposed to noise at or above an 8 – hour time-weighted average of 85 dBA. The training program is conducted annually for each employee included in the Hearing Conservation program.

The training program reflects the following:

1. The effects of noise on hearing;
2. The purpose of hearing protectors, the advantages disadvantages, and attenuation of various types, and instructions on selection, fitting, use, and care;
3. the purpose of audiometric testing, and an explanation of the test procedures;
4. Have available Article 105, Control of Noise Exposure Regulation, to all affected employees or their representative;
5. Provide any informational materials pertaining to Hearing Conservation that are available to the University by the U.S. Department of Labor, Occupational Safety and Health Administration.
