

Job Hazard	Hazard Control
Traffic hazards while directing traffic	Undergo proper traffic control training; proper use of delineators, barricades and reflective/highly visible apparel
Traffic hazards while traveling from location to location and remote areas	Undergo proper driving and remote travel planning training
Potential exposure to hazardous materials and infectious agents during floor checks, rescues and apprehensions	Training in Hazard Communications, bloodborne pathogens and TB control. Receive immunization against infectious agents (HBV) and annual screening for TB.
Exposure to loud noise while shooting firearms	Undergo PPE training for proper use of ear-plugs / ear muffs. Participation in campus hearing conservation program
Hazards related to <i>Administrative Personnel</i>	See <i>Administrative Personnel Job Hazard Assessment</i>
