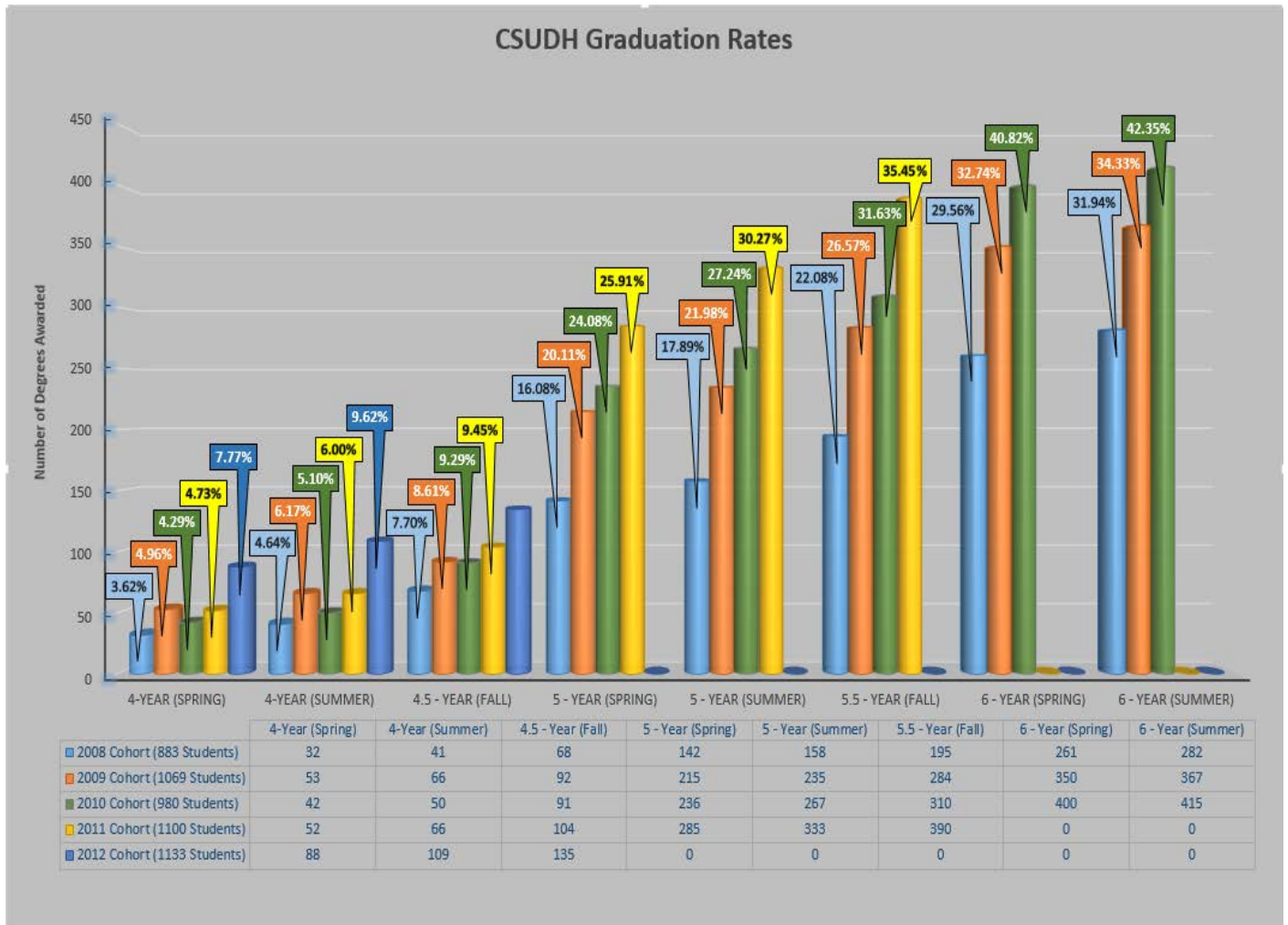

Graduation Rate Comparison since 2008 (with Projections) as of Friday, July 29, 2016



Graduation Rate Projections (7/29/2016) versus Actual (1/10/2017) 2010, 2011, & 2012

2012 Cohort - 4.5 year graduation rate

In July 2016 the projected 4.5 year graduation rate for the 2012 cohort was 135 students (11.92%). As of January 2017 the actual 4.5 year graduation rate for the 2012 cohort is 161 students (14.21%).

2011 Cohort - 5.5 year graduation rate

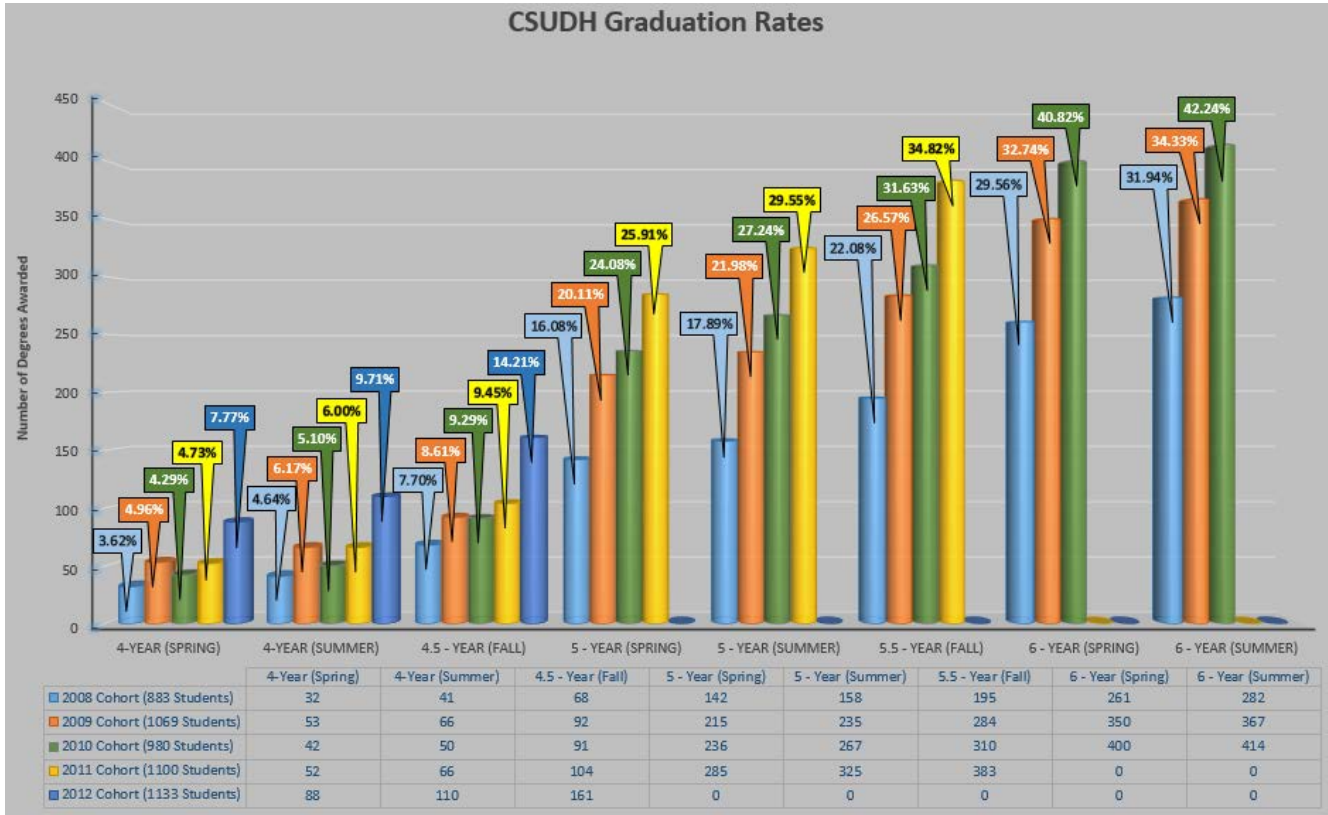
In July 2016 the projected 5.5 year graduation rate for the 2011 cohort was 390 students (35.45%). As of January 2017 the actual 5.5 year graduation rate for the 2011 cohort is 383 students (34.82%).

2010 Cohort - 6 year graduation rate

In July 2016 the projected 6 year graduation rate for the 2010 cohort was 415 students (42.35%). As of January 2017 the actual 6 year graduation rate for the 2010 cohort is 414 students (42.24%).

4.5 year graduation rate increases

In Fall 2014 the 2010 Cohort had a 4.5 year graduation rate of 9.29%.
 In Fall 2015 the 2011 Cohort had a 4.5 year graduation rate of 9.45%.
 In Fall 2016 the 2012 Cohort has a 4.5 year graduation rate of 14.21%.

5.5 year graduation rate increases

In Fall 2015 the 2010 Cohort had a 5.5 year graduation rate of 31.63%.
 In Fall 2016 the 2011 Cohort has a 5.5 year graduation rate of 34.82%.

6 year graduation rate

The Graduation Innovation Team is working to review 2011 Cohort students that were denied graduation in Fall 2016 (12 students) in order to help those students graduate in Spring 2017. In addition, they are working to ensure that they support their other 2011 Cohort students to graduate in Spring 2017 and Summer 2017.

- 1.) According to student self-reported requests to graduate the 2011 Cohort could have a graduation rate of 43.00% (473 students). With denied students from Spring 2016, Summer 2016, & Fall 2016 we could add another 25 students for an estimated total of 498 (45.27%).
- 2.) According to Graduation Innovation Team interventions the 2011 Cohort could have a graduation rate of 41.27% (454 students). With denied students from Spring 2016, Summer 2016, & Fall 2016 we could add another 25 students for an estimated total of 479 (43.54%).

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Important Things to Remember about Projections

- 1.) Projections are based on a students' graduation status, which is self-reported data since the student has chosen to apply to graduate in their respective term.
- 2.) All data is subject to change daily depending on the number of graduation applicants, students changing their graduation date, turning in outside transcripts, and changes in enrollment.
- 3.) We are working on improving efficiencies and access to data. Currently the Division of Student Affairs is working with the Division of Academic Affairs by hiring a consultant to develop a higher efficiency in query data from the Academic Requirement Reports so that we can determine deficiencies more quickly.
