Failure to apply in accordance with the schedule below could delay your degree past your intended graduation date. Also there will be additional fees assessed for applying after the regular deadline.

Spring Semester	October 1	Last day of fall semester
Summer Session	February 1	April 15

Please note that if the above dates fall on a weekend or holiday, the deadline will be the previous working day.
