Deviant Workplace Behavior in Public Agencies

This paper analyzes original survey data of 65 non-managerial public sector employees to examines the factors influencing deviant workplace behavior. The regression results suggest that individual factors (i.e., respectfulness, cooperativeness, and self-control) and organizational factors (i.e., distributive justice perceptions and informational justice perceptions) have an impact on deviant workplace behavior. Public organizations are recommended to implement fair and ethical recruitment processes as well as ethics and diversity training.

Educational Funding and High School Graduation Rate: An Analysis

This study examines the relationship between adequate funding and student achievement. Results show that poverty levels is a more reliable predictor of high school graduation rates than K-12 funding levels. The study has wide implications for students, teachers, parents, legislators and public administrators. Specifically, wholesale increase in educational funding, the main argument of many recent teacher strikes, may not translate into higher student achievement. This study recommends an expanded federal government role in education along with focused attention on low income students.

Improving the Experience of Public Administration Program Students at California State University, Dominguez Hills

The objective of this paper is to improve the quality and website design of the Public Administration Program (PUB) at the CSUDH. Through the initial research about the program description and policy, we explored the barriers the program has and then identified key stakeholders, formed a hypothesis, and collectively came up with a research question. We also conducted interviews and surveys, analyzed the data, and incorporated helpful suggestions and promotional material that could help enhance student experience and make the program's website more accessible for students.

Entrepreneurial Activity in Southern California

This paper involves case studies of five cities in Southern California that employ a variety of methods to support entrepreneurial activity such as mall business loans, tax incentives, business walks, and incubators. We discovered that cities do not disclose direct data on entrepreneurial activity because more than half of small businesses don not make it to their fifth year. We also examined the Innovation Incubator program at CSUDH. The recommendation is for cities to provide incubators to coach and support entrepreneurs through the difficult start-up processes.

About the PAA Best Capstone Awards

The awards are given annually to a graduate student and a group of undergraduate students who have successfully completed their capstone projects in the previous calendar year (through PUB490 or PUB592). A cash prize of \$200 is awarded to the best paper and \$50 to the runner-up. Both individual and group capstone projects are eligible for the competition. The student author (or at least one of the student co-authors) must be a Pi Alpha Alpha member.
