ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:

Prospective students must hold an acceptable baccalaureate degree from an accredited college or university, be in good standing at the last institution attended and have a GPA of at least 3.0 in the last 60 semester (90 quarter) upper division units OR at least 2.75 cumulative GPA.

Applications must include a current professional resume or CV, and a 1-2 page double-spaced personal statement addressing the following prompt:

Discuss your decision to pursue a Master of Public Administration degree. There are five domains essential to public service – leading and managing in public governance, participating or impacting the public policy process, ability to critically analyze problems and providing viable solutions or direction, providing a public service perspective in your professional career, and able to work in a diverse and global environment. In this narrative, explain how these areas of public service informs your decision and shape your career aspirations.
