

## Fees

Registration is not considered complete until CSUDH receives bank clearance for your check, or authorization for your credit card. Additionally, you should receive a confirmation letter within two weeks after CSUDH receives your registration and fees. When you register in person, you will receive an Extension student ID card which entitles you to library privileges.

If you choose to mail in your registration forms and fees, your confirmation of enrollment and ID card will be mailed to you. Courses you enroll in become part of your permanent academic record at CSUDH. Summer Sessions students are subject to the same withdrawal, grading and academic policies as degree students.

May 28, 100% of the fees will be refunded (less \$10 processing fee). From May 29–June 3, 75% of the fees will be refunded. From June 4–10, 50% of the fees will be refunded. Beginning June 11, no refund will be made.

## Refunds: Summer Session 2

If a student drops a class on or before July 6, 100% of the fees will be refunded (less \$10 processing fee). From July 8–12, 75% of the fees will be refunded. From July 13–19, 50% of the fees will be refunded. Beginning July 20, no refund will be made.

*Refunds are not automatic.* You must file appropriate forms in the College of Continuing and Professional Education Registration Office in order to receive a refund. Refunds take a minimum of 6–8 weeks for processing. Do not put a stop-payment on a check to withdraw from a course. This results in a financial obligation to the University for the course fee, plus an additional \$25

charge, plus a \$25 late fee. If the University cancels a class, the student will receive a full refund of applicable fees or will be allowed to register in another class without payment of a late fee.

### Dishonored Check Policy

Once a check has been dishonored, no personal checks will be accepted from that person for a period of at least two academic terms. This rule applies to any check returned from any financial institution for any reason. The person will be required to pay all university-related debts with a certified check, money order or traveler's check(s) including the \$25.00 returned check fee. Discrepancies not resolved before final exams may result in loss of credit for the class.

### Verification of Enrollment

To verify that you have been officially enrolled in your classes, check the instructor's printed class roster which is published the fourth week of the term. Summer Sessions students will appear on the same roster as students enrolled in degree programs. If your name is not on the roster, call the College of Continuing & Professional Education Office immediately. It is the student's responsibility to initiate inquiries regarding his/her registration in a course. Discrepancies not resolved before final exams may result in loss of credit for the class.

### Academic Eligibility and Credit Information

All Qualified Students are eligible to register for CSUDH Summer Sessions. This includes students attending other universities, students who are not currently enrolled in college, international students, and qualified high school students. High school students who are rising juniors and above can take lower-division courses with the permission of their high school counselor and principal.

### New or Returning Students

You are a new student if you have not attended CSUDH previously.

You are a returning student if you:

- are an undergraduate student and have not enrolled for two or more semesters;
- are a graduate student and have not enrolled for one semester;
- attended another academic institution since last attending CSUDH; or

- graduated from CSUDH and choose to begin post-graduate studies. Returning students must reapply for admission.
- Failure to pay registration fees will result in cancellation of your application and you will be required to reapply for any subsequent term.

### Returning from an Approved Planned Educational Leave

You must submit a completed CSU application (no application fee required) to Admission and Records as official notification of your intent to return from an approved Planned Educational Leave. If you have taken courses at another institution during your leave, you must also provide official transcripts. To be eligible for Registration, your application to return must be submitted and processed prior to the Registration dates listed earlier (the deadline to submit an application to return from a Planned Leave is the first day of the academic term in which you plan to return). Please contact Admissions & Records for further questions concerning Planned Educational Leave processing at (310) 243-3645.

### Continuing Students

You are considered a continuing student if you:

- attended CSUDH as a matriculated student in the Spring 2024 or Fall 2023 semester;
- are a graduate student who has attended CSUDH as a matriculated student in the Fall 2023 semester;
- have not attended another academic institution since attending CSUDH, and have not applied to graduate from CSUDH in the Fall 2024 term.

### Mathematics Classes

Students wishing to enroll in several mathematics classes will have to provide evidence of having satisfied the ELM requirements. This requirement can be satisfied by either of the following methods:

1. Passing the ELM examination administered by the University Testing Office (call **310-243-3909** for information).
2. Transcripts showing passing grades on college level mathematics courses. CSUDH graduates can have their records verified by the Office of Admissions and Records.

Official verification must be received by the Continuing Education Registration office before the student can enroll in mathematics classes. Verification may be obtained at the University Advisement Center (located in Welch Hall), or the Math Department (Natural Sciences & Mathematics Building), room A-132.

### College of Business Administration and Public Policy

All Summer Sessions students who wish to register for business, criminal justice and public administration courses and needs a permission number, send an email with required information as stated below. Failure to submit all required information will void the request. Depending on the number of requests, students can expect to wait 2-3 business days for a response. Please do not send multiple emails.

## Credit/No Credit Option (Undergraduate Students Only)

Undergraduate students selecting the Credit/No Credit option must do so by the end of the third week of instruction:

Regular Session: June 18, 2024  
Summer Session One: June 4, 2024  
Summer Session Two: July 13, 2024

Credit/No Credit forms are available from the Extension Office, the Office of Records & Registration, and Information and Service Center, and must be submitted by the deadline. For additional conditions or limitations of the Credit/No Credit option, consult the current CSUDH catalog.

## ADD or DROP Classes

1. Complete the ADD/DROP information on the Change of Program form, available from the College of Continuing & Professional Education Registration Office EE-1100, in the Continuing Education Complex. Use the schedule number (5 numbers), department name (3 letters), course number (3 numbers) and section number (2 numbers).
2. If adding, have the instructor sign the form.
3. If dropping, enter the information in the DROP position of the card. Instructor's signature is not required before end of third week.
4. Return the Change of Program form to the Continuing Education Office.
5. Present your receipt and I.D. card.
6. Conditions for dropping a course after the third week are outlined in the current CSUDH Catalog.

A student who enrolls in a course, discontinues attendance, and does not officially drop the course will automatically receive a "WU" (calculated as "F" in G.P.A.) or "F" grade for the course, which is permanently recorded. Students are responsible for submitting completed drop or withdrawal forms to the designated offices.

## General Information

### Grades

For Academic Programs, student performance in each course is reported at the end of the session by one of the following grades (with grade points earned):

The following grades are to be used for approved courses only:

- I** Incomplete authorized—(not counted in GPA)
- IC** Incomplete charged
- WU** Withdrawal Unauthorized
- W** Withdrawal—(not counted in GPA)
- AU** Audit—(not counted in GPA, no units allowed)
- CR** Credit (not counted in grade average, but units allowed)
- CR\*** Credit in sub-collegiate course, (no units)
- NC** No Credit (not counted in GPA, no units allowed)
- RP** Report in Progress—credit is deferred until completion of course  
\*\*\* (Graduate Continuation Course)
- RD** (Report Delayed)

### Course Numbering System

The course numbering system for the University is based upon three-digit numbers as follows:

- 000-099 Sub-collegiate courses, not for baccalaureate credit
- 100-199 Lower division courses, normally taken in the freshman year
- 200-299 Lower division courses, normally taken in the sophomore year
- 300-399 Upper division courses, normally taken in the junior year
- 400-499 Upper division courses, normally taken in the senior year
- 500-599 Graduate courses, normally limited to graduate students

### Use of the I.D. Card

The I.D. Card must be carried at all times and be validated each term. A current I.D. Card is necessary to perform certain transactions in Admissions, Records and Registration, the Library, the Business Office and other campus offices. I.D. cards for Summer Sessions students will be issued at the CCPE Registration Office.

## Disabled Student Services

Students with verified disabilities, which are permanent or temporary (e.g., broken bones, strained back, other sprains, etc.) are eligible for a variety of support services from the Disabled Student Services Office. Information regarding special facilities and services available to students with a disability may be obtained from the Director of Disabled Student Services Office, located in Welch Hall, Room B-250, (310) 243-3660 (voice) or 243-2028 (TDD).

## CCPE Office Hours

The College of Continuing & Professional Education Registration Office is located in the Continuing Education Complex EE-1100, on the west side of the campus, just south of Victoria Street. The CCPE Registration Office is open for **in-person and phone service**: 8am–5pm Monday–Thursday and 9am–5pm Friday; Virtual hours are also available. The telephone number is (310) 243-3741 (Option 1).

## Parking

Parking permits are required for on-campus classes, and are available from the yellow machines at the entrance of each parking lot for \$10.00 per day.

A 4-wheeled vehicle parking permit good for the semester may be purchased for \$122.00 from the Cashier's Office. Summer Session car parking permits are \$67.00 per session or \$14.00 weekly. A 2-wheeled vehicle parking permit is \$22.00 for any session.

Electric vehicle charging stations are available on a limited basis.

## Library Services

Student identifications cards—available at the Continuing Education Office—will entitle you to full use of the Cain Education Resources Center.

## Privacy Information

The University complies with Federal and State laws concerning privacy rights of students. These rights are summarized in the University Catalog. ## Use of Social Security Number

CSUDH provides all students with generic 9 digit student ID numbers. These ID numbers are used to identify student records, registration, and to conduct all University business. However, students are still required to provide the University with their correct social security numbers (individual taxpayer identification numbers) pursuant to the authority contained in Section 41201, Title 5, California Code of Regulations, and Section 6109 of the Internal Revenue Code.

The University uses the social security number to identify records pertaining to the student and, if needed, to collect debts owed the University. Also, the Internal Revenue Service requires the University to file information returns that include the student's social security number and other information such as the amount paid for qualified tuition, related expenses, and interest on educational loans. That information is used to help determine whether a student, or a person claiming a student as a dependent, may take a credit or deduction to reduce federal income taxes. Students who do not have a social security number at the time of enrollment will be required to obtain a social security number and submit it to the University within sixty days. Failure to furnish a correct social security number may result in the imposition of a penalty by the Internal Revenue Service.

## Immigration Requirements for Licensure

On August 27, 1996, Governor Pete Wilson issued Executive Order W-135-96 which requested that the CSU and other state agencies implement "as expeditiously as reasonably practicable" the provision of The Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act (PRAWORA) of 1996 Reconciliation Act (PRAWORA) of 1996 (P.L.104-193). The Act, also known as the Welfare Reform Act, included provisions to eliminate eligibility for federal and

state public benefits for certain categories of lawful immigrants as well as benefits for all illegal immigrants.

Students who will require a professional or commercial license provided by a local, state, or federal government agency in order to engage in an occupation for which the CSU may be training them must meet the immigration requirements of the new Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act to achieve licensure. Information concerning the regulation is available from the Vice President of Student Affairs, (310) 243-3784.

## Important Tax Credit Information

If you are enrolled in an eligible degree or certificate program or are taking courses to acquire or improve job skills, you may qualify for a Hope Scholarship or Lifetime Learning Tax Credit. The Hope Scholarship Tax Credit is available only to students in their first two years of postsecondary education who are enrolled at least half-time in an eligible program. The tax credits are based on the amount of qualified tuition and fees, less grants and other tax-free educational assistance and the taxpayer's modified adjusted gross income. Hope credits apply to fees paid after December 31, 1997.

## The Lifetime Learning Tax Credit

The Lifetime Learning tax credit is available to students at all educational and enrollment levels who are enrolled at an eligible educational institution. As with the Hope Scholarship tax credit, this opportunity is based on the amount of qualified tuition and fees, less grants and other tax-free educational assistance and the taxpayer's modified adjusted gross income. The Lifetime Learning credit applies to fees paid after June 30, 1998.

Consult IRS Publication 970 or your tax preparer for additional information on both programs.

## Americans with Disabilities Act

It is the policy of California State University Dominguez Hills to comply with the Section 504 Regulations [now, Americans with Disabilities Act] adopted by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. Accordingly, any student at California State University Dominguez Hills who believes that there has been a

violation of the Regulations is encouraged to discuss the matter with the appropriate CSUDH college, the campus Handicapped Regulations Coordinator, and/ or the Handicapped Services Coordinator, and such persons as may be identified by the Handicapped Regulations Coordinator in order to resolve the matter in a prompt and equitable manner.

## Sexual Harassment Policy

In determining whether conduct actually constitutes sexual harassment, the circumstances surrounding the conduct will be carefully considered. However, where the facts support the allegations, all appropriate measures including disciplinary action will be taken.
