

# CSUDH | SUSTAINABILITY Walking Map



- 1 This cutting-edge commercial kitchen features all-electric appliances as part of a grant through Southern California Edison.
  - 2 CSUDH buildings are equipped with innovative energy-efficient lighting, HVAC, and occupancy sensors that have earned multiple recognitions and awards from the State of California.
  - 3 The weekly Farmers Market brings fresh farm produce to the South Walkway every Tuesday 9am-3pm during the semester as well as EBT/Market Match services.
  - 4 This nationally recognized Tesla battery storage array allows the university to store 1MW/4 hrs of energy to reduce impact on the electrical grid.
  - 5 This 100% renewable energy picnic shelter features net zero technologies and also meeting space for the Sustainability Club.
  - 6 The Science building is LEED Platinum certified, the highest green building LEED rating possible.
  - 7 Follow the signs for the campus walking trail to go on a flat ~2 mile walking loop of CSUDH and Dignity Sports Health Park.
  - 8 This is one of multiple ecological areas and gardens on campus featuring California native species. Check the "Landscape" section of the Sustainability website for more info.
  - 9 The Campus Urban Farm grows fresh produce for students in-need. Visit the "Farm" section of the Sustainability website for more info.

- 10 There are hydration stations to refill your reusable water bottle on every water fountain in stateside buildings.
  - 11 Recycle used batteries at the public campus drop-off locations at the Visitor Information Center (WH), COE lobby, Library Front Desk, Physical Plant front desk, and/or IT Help Desk (NSM 151)
  - 12 There is almost 1MW of rooftop solar on five campus buildings: Gym, SCI, Library, SBS, and WH



## Locations of Other Services:

- There are dedicated EV (electric vehicle) charging station parking spots in Lot 2 & 3 as well as LaCorte Hall.
- The bus stop in front of Small College is serviced by three different bus lines (Carson, Torrance, Metro) as well as the free Toro Express campus shuttle to the Metro Blue Line and Artesia Transit Center.
- Hydration stations are located on every campus water fountain. Bring a reusable water bottle to refill and go plastic free!
- Food scraps recycling is offered on every campus zero waste bin. Sort your food waste into the green "compost" section to reduce greenhouse gases and help fight climate change.
- Public battery recycling bins are located in the Visitor Information Center (WH 245), COE Lobby, Library Front Desk (2nd floor entrance), Facilities Services Front Desk (Physical Plant), and the IT Help Desk (NSM C151).
- The weekly Farmers Market is located on the South Walkway (between the LSU and Library), and is there every Tuesday during the semester from 9am-3pm. In addition to featuring EBT/Market Match benefits for fresh produce, the Farmers Market is also where you can visit the Office of Sustainability booth. The first and last market of every semester will feature our Pop Up Thrift offerings where you can either donate or take office supplies, household goods, clothing, and other essentials for free!

### Where to Start:

Even small actions can help our campus go green. If every one of our 17,000+ Toros does their part, we can make a big difference in reducing our campus footprint!



The campus has nearly 1MW of rooftop solar as well as a 1MW/4 hour Tesla battery storage system which offsets about a third of our campus energy consumption. We rely on Toros to help us cut consumption on the rest!



We also use 54 million gallons of water, and produce almost 1200 tons of landfill waste every year.

### Save Money

• Purchase a Toro Token (\$5) at Toro Fresh to gain access to a clean reusable container every visit as well as special deals on your meals there!



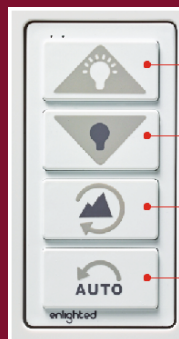
• Instead of buying bottled water, fill up at our free on-campus hydration stations instead.

• Take advantage of the Bookstore’s rental and buyback program for textbooks. Save some green by going green!

### Report Waste

Report water leaks, hot/cold issues, and other maintenance issues to Facilities Work Control at 310-243-3804 right away, even if you think someone else will take care of it. Help us save water and energy!

Need help saving energy by turning off or adjusting the lights in one of the newer classrooms?



- + Press and Release — On to full
- + Press and Hold — Raise light level to maximum dimmed output
- + Press and Release — Off
- + Press and Hold — Lowers light level to minimum dimmed output
- + Press and Release — Cycle
- + Press and Hold — No action
- + Press and Release — Automatic mode returns to programmed profile

### Avoid the Landfill

Trash goes directly to the landfill. If you have an item that can be recycled, get it to the right bin!



Blue bins or blue lids accept:
• Plastics (hard)
• Paper & Cardboard
• Cartons and waxy paper
• Metal- cans, scrap metal
• Glass- jars, containers, all colors



Green “Compost” compartment in grey zero waste bins accept:
Food only! No packaging except clear plastic bags used to hold the scraps is allowed.
• Meats and proteins, bones, baked goods, pastas, fruits, veggies are all acceptable!

### Reduce Your Commute

• Take the free Toro Express campus shuttle to get to and from major Metro lines. Taking 12 units or more? Get a discounted Metro/TAP card from the Parking Office (visit csudh.edu/rideshare).

### Make Greener Food & Event Choices

• Locally-sourced and vegan/vegetarian options are better for the environment. Shop at the weekly campus Farmers Market (every Tuesday 9am-3pm on the South Walkway during the semester) and/or order vegan and vegetarian options at DH Dining locations.

• Hungry? Find out if you’re eligible for CalFresh benefits and access to Market Match dollars at the weekly Farmers Market, Farm produce, food recovery events, and more (visit: csudh.edu/student-services/food-shelter-resources/).
