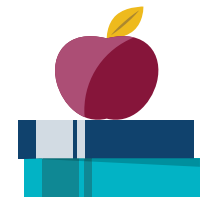

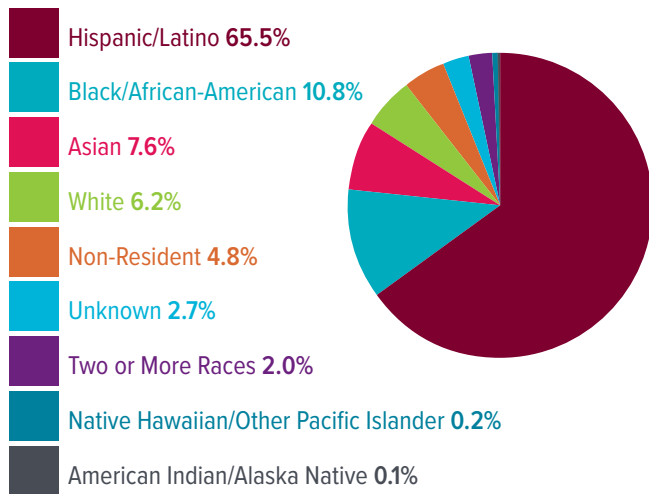

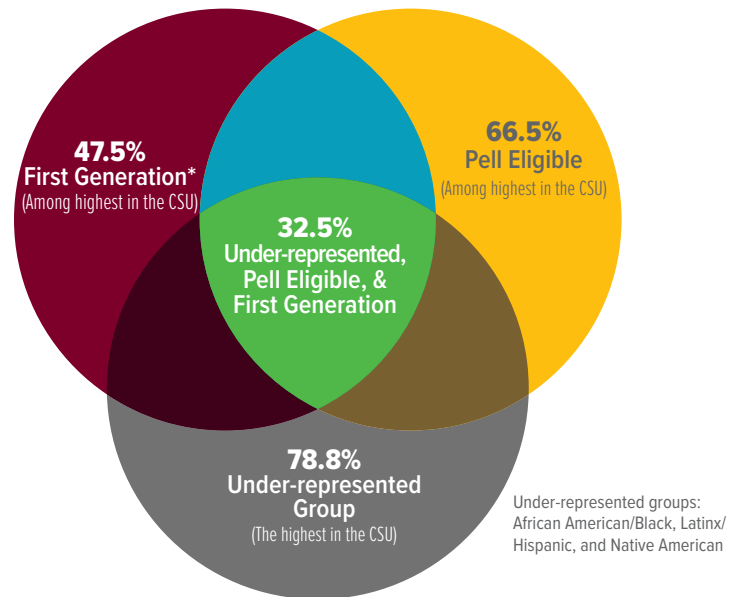

UNDERGRADUATE POPULATION

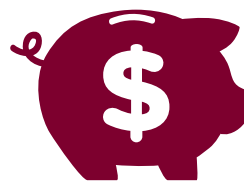


70.7% of students' parents have little or no college

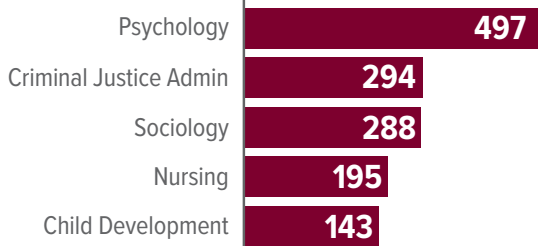

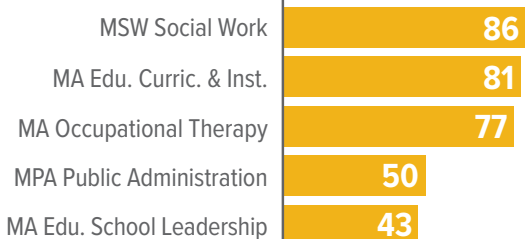
